Cast

David Clark as Sidney Bruhl

Sidney is just as verbose as any of them, however! He also gets to play opposite real-world wife Angela as her husband, for the first time ever, which is an added bonus for him... if not for her.

Angela Clark as Myra Bruhl

Angela has been appearing at the MLT for many years now. Most notably in *French Fancies, The Graduate,* and *Mr Wonderful,* all of which were alongside the director of this play, Del. This is the second time she has been directed by Del who was very glad to get her on board. In her spare time Angela sings with a choir and enjoys a glass of wine. And another one.

Cameron McColm as Clifford Anderson

Cameron is currently taking a gap year. Having studied GCSE and A-level Drama he now wishes to pursue the profession further. He has secured a place at London South Bank University to study drama and performance from September 2019. Del de Lorme, director

Del has been acting and directing at the MLT since 1996. He has appeared in over forty productions. He was Lenny in *Of Mice and Men*, Oscar in *The Odd Couple*, Adam in the recent hit *Someone Who'll Watch Over Me* and five characters in the spoof *The Hound of the Baskervilles*. He won the KDA directors award for *The Graduate*. He also wrote the theme song for *The Accrington Pals* and the music for several other productions including *Mother Courage*.
